

# STAMP SCOOP



## SONGBIRDS

Nearly half of the world's bird species – from small chirpers to large squawkers like the crow – are **songbirds**. Belonging to the suborder *Passeri*, male songbirds use their highly developed vocal organs to attract females, and to warn rival males to stay out of their territory.

The **Western Meadowlark** has a distinct yellow breast and “flutelike” song. It is the state bird of six states, second only to the northern cardinal.

The **Mountain Bluebird** is covered almost head to talon in brilliant blue feathers. A symbol of happiness, it is seen quite often in western states.

The **Western Tanager** has a fiery red mask, black wings, and yellow breast, which somehow doesn't hinder it from foraging for insects high up in the trees of western forests.

The **Painted Bunting**, called nonpareil or “without equal” in French, is one of the most vivid birds in America, breeding in the south central and southeastern US.

The **Baltimore Oriole** is the state bird of Maryland, named after George Calvert, Lord of Baltimore. The oriole's coloring resembles Calvert's coat of arms.

The **Evening Grosbeak** breeds in evergreen and mountain territories, venturing southward in the winter to find food. They eat big seeds, cracking them open with their thick beaks.

The **Scarlet Tanager** is a traveler, migrating from summer homes as far north as Canada to forests as far south as Peru in the winter, when their brilliant red feathers molt to a dull green.

The **Rose-Breasted Grosbeak** has a signature red slash across his chest. Uniquely, both sexes sing and share nesting duty, warbling to each other when switching tasks.

The **American Goldfinch** is found in all 48 contiguous states and is known for its “bouncy” flight. Its bright yellow, black-capped feathers make it easy to spot.

The **White-Throated Sparrow** nests on or near the ground, where it can easily find insects and seeds. It has a striped head, yellow patch between its eyes, and a white throat, giving it its name.
